Question: What is Journalism?

Real Answer: Journalism is newspaper production, yearbook production, web design, digital photography, broadcasting, video production, pod casting, computer knowledge, marketing, trips, fun and more!

Classes Offered-

[Journalism 1]

Introduction to all aspects of journalism including- News writing, newspaper production, photography, web design, history of journalism, broadcasting, intro to radio and radio news, yearbook production, advertising and more.

[Advanced Journalism] *Yearbook*

This class is responsible for the publication of the school yearbook. Students will continue their skills in yearbook writing, photography, advertising, layout, and graphic design. The second year will also count as a technology credit.

[Advanced Journalism] *Newspaper*

This class is responsible for the production of the school newspaper. Students will refine skills in writing, editing, advertising, reporting, photography, desktop publishing, and news production. Students usually compete in UIL academic events for journalism as well.

[Broadcast Journalism] *Podcasting*

Real world journalism includes more than just ink and paper. Legacy will soon launch an interactive online newspaper. Legacy Journalism also received a Think Big Grant from the MISD Foundation to build a \$10,000 video/podcasting lab. Next year we're opening a Broadcast Journalism class to utilize this new equipment. Video news will be posted weekly on the online newspaper site.
